Sticky Knowledge

Parents/Carers can help children by discussing these essential facts and skills with their children.

Science

Everyday objects are made from different materials.
Common materials include wood, plastic, metal, glass, fabric, and rock. Materials have different properties. Some materials are hard or soft, rough or smooth, strong or weak, and bendy or rigid.
Materials are chosen because of their properties.
Some materials can change shape when they are squashed, bent, twisted or stretched.
Different materials are used to make different objects depending on their use.

Geography

Children know the difference between human-made features (houses, roads, pier) and natural features (beach, cliffs, hills).
Children know Shelf is inland and Saltburn is a coastal town next to the North Sea.
Children can describe simple similarities and differences between Shelf and Saltburn (e.g., no beach in Shelf, pier and sea in Saltburn).
Children know seaside towns can be windier and busier in summer because of visitors.
Children know people may have different jobs in each place.

PSHE

Wellbeing means feeling healthy, safe and happy.
We can look after our wellbeing by talking about our feelings.
Everyone has different emotions, and they are all important.
Trusted adults can help us if we feel worried or unsafe.
Some situations are safe, and some are unsafe.
We should know how to ask for help when we need it.
Our bodies belong to us.
We can help keep ourselves safe at home, school, online and outside.
